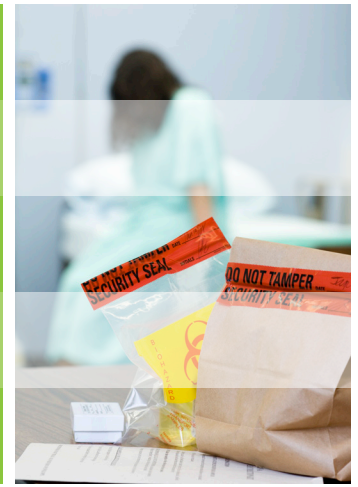

This course provides a clinical and forensic science based model of care for forensic assessment and evaluation of patients/victims of trauma, violence and crime across the lifespan. Includes: child maltreatment, interpersonal violence, elder maltreatment, sexual assault, toxicology, and intentional/non-intentional trauma.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- > To apply forensic terminology to the clinical management of victims of trauma, violence and crime.

- > To outline categories of forensic evidence in various forms such as physical, direct and trace.
- > To outline how to collect forensic evidence from victims of trauma, violence and crime.
- > To assess the difference between medical and clinical forensic documentation procedures including accuracy, completeness and chain of custody for forensic evidence collection.
- > To interpret the effects of alcohol and drug toxicology on the human body.
- > To outline the judicial role and qualifications of an expert witness versus a medical witness within the Canadian justice system.
